Two Georgia Tech researchers, <u>Matthew McDowell and Ryan Lively</u>, have been named finalists for the 2025 Blavatnik National Awards for Young Scientists. Their discoveries, which could create cleaner industrial processes and safer, more reliable batteries, have important potential impacts for daily life.



<u>Jianjun Shi</u>, the Carolyn J. Stewart Chair and Professor in the H. Milton Stewart School of Industrial and Systems Engineering, received the 2025 Deming Lecturer Award from the American Statistical Association.
